
Public Transportation Information

The <u>DART</u> is the most efficient way to travel between the Royal Marine Hotel and Dublin City Centre. The closest train station to the hotel is Dun Laoghaire Train Station. The train fares can be paid for by card or cash. Tickets can be purchased from a staffed ticket window or from machines which are easy to use as there is not always a person present. The machines accept credit cards. A ticket between the hotel and city center costs about 3 Euros.

Directions from Royal Marine Hotel to Dun Laoghaire Train Station:



- 1. Upon exiting the hotel, turn left and walk until you exit the premises out onto the main road.
- 2. Once you hit the road you do not have to cross, just turn right and walk straight down the path.
- 3. At the next intersection you cross straight across the road and when you turn to the left the Dun Laoghaire train station is in front of you.

You can purchase tickets in the station. If you plan to visit somewhere in the City Centre on the south side, you are best to get off at Dublin Pearse Station or Tara Street Station. If you plan to visit somewhere on the North side, you are best to get off at Dublin Connolly Station. Visit www.irishrail.ie for more information on times and your journeys.

The Stations typically run in the following order:

- Dun Laoghaire (near the Royal Marine Hotel)
- Salthill and Monkstown
- Seapoint
- Blackrock
- Boooterstown
- Sydney Parade

- Sandymount
- Lansdowne Road
- Grand Canal Dock
- Dublin Pearse
- Tara Street
- Dublin Conolly

Attractions like Aviva stadium, Trinity College Dublin, Guinness Storehouse, Jameson Whiskey Distillery, Teelings Whiskey Distillery, St. Stephens Green & Grafton Street are all South Side.

Attractions like O'Connell Street, The Spire, The Portal (New York and Dublin Link), Henry's Street, EPIC Emmigration Museum and Croke Park are all North Side.

Keep in mind when you get off the train some attractions are walking distance and others may need another short form of transport like the Tram (LUAS) or the bus (Dublin Bus)

Traveling from Dublin City Centre to the Royal Marine Hotel (Dun Laoghaire train station)

Please review the information above. Most places people want to visit tend to be on the South side of the city.

The train stations in this area are:

- Lansdowne Road
- Grand Canal Dock
- Dublin Pearse
- Tara Street

The times for last trains differ based on the station you are returning from. Trains do not run 24/7 in Dublin. They usually operate 6am-12am and the last train leaves central Dublin about 11:30pm.

We recommend using Google maps to search your journey from your current location to the Royal Marine Hotel. When you click the train logo at the top it will give you the length of time of your journey as well as what stop is closest to you.
